



My name is Jairia, where I believe that being curvey is a MINDSET. I have the dream to share my smile and confidence to help other women find



I want to lead people to that place for themselves. That's but a mere fraction of my great dream.


















From Survivor to Thriver: Vivian Tobar's Inspiring Journey to Freedom

In the dimly lit corridors of domestic violence, where despair and fear often shroud the light of hope, one voice emerges triumphant, telling a story that needs to be heard. Vivian Tobar, a Domestic Violence Survivor, defied the odds to break free from an abusive relationship, and today, she stands as a beacon of hope, empowerment, and resilience. A Deceptive Beginning
