


Some goals I have this year is to get to as much tournaments as I can, I really love competing!


I want to unlock my full potential. I like to roll my nuggets before my practice. It gives me confidence. My dream is to win a gold medal in every tournament.













"A Triumph of Determination: Navigating ADHD and Autism on the Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu Mats"



match by 3-0. I am always ready for challenges and clicking pictures. My dream is to become a professional jiu jitsu player














hard so long to achieve that. My dream now is to get to participate in the bigger renowned events. Sometimes, I also like to visit beaches and have a relaxing time.



















One highlight in 2024 we're looking forward to is we have a few members in Muay Thai World Cup in Calgary, Alberta - April 20th 2024









Started up 2021. We run classes Monday-Saturday, Kids to Adults and all levels welcome.


