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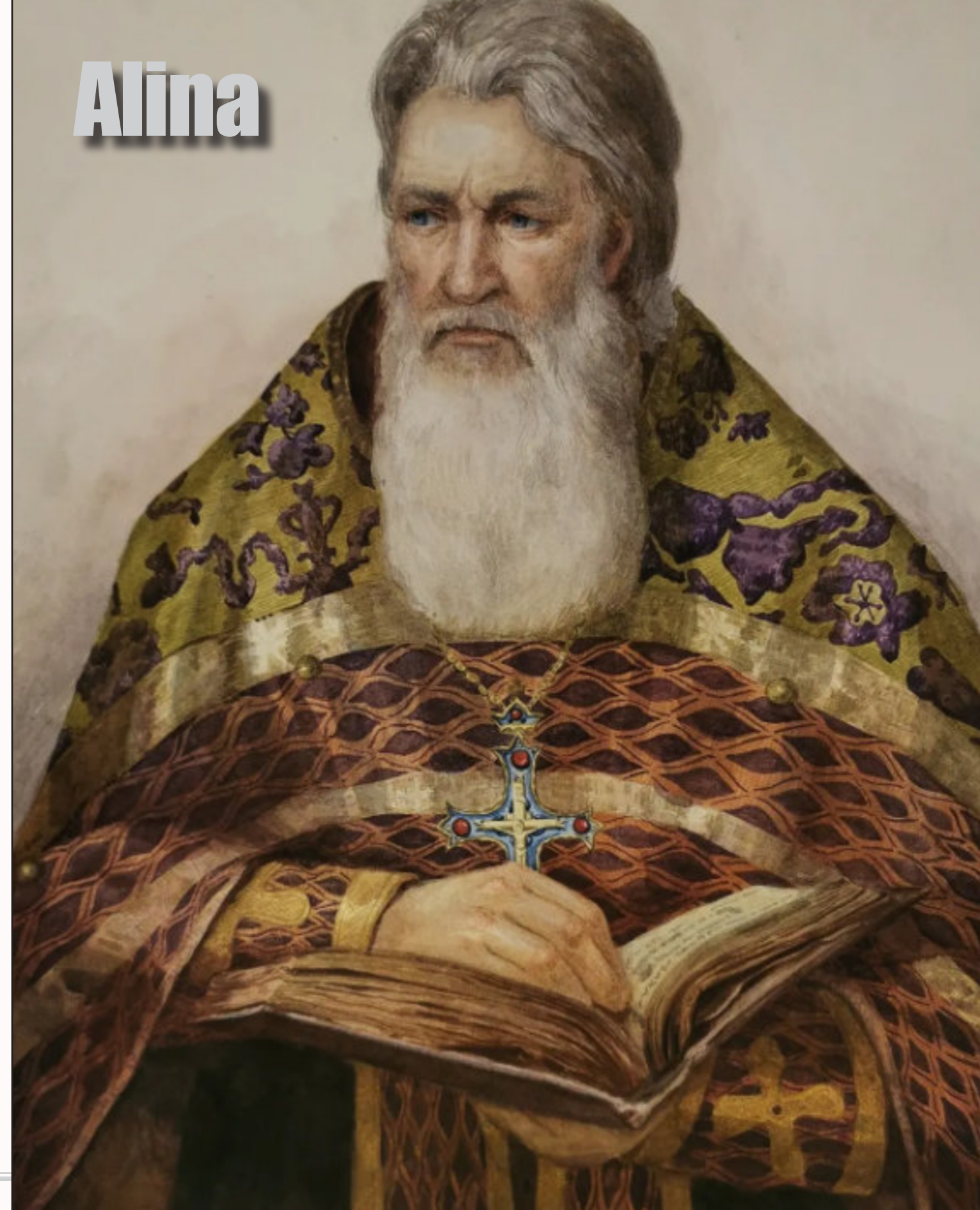
Alina

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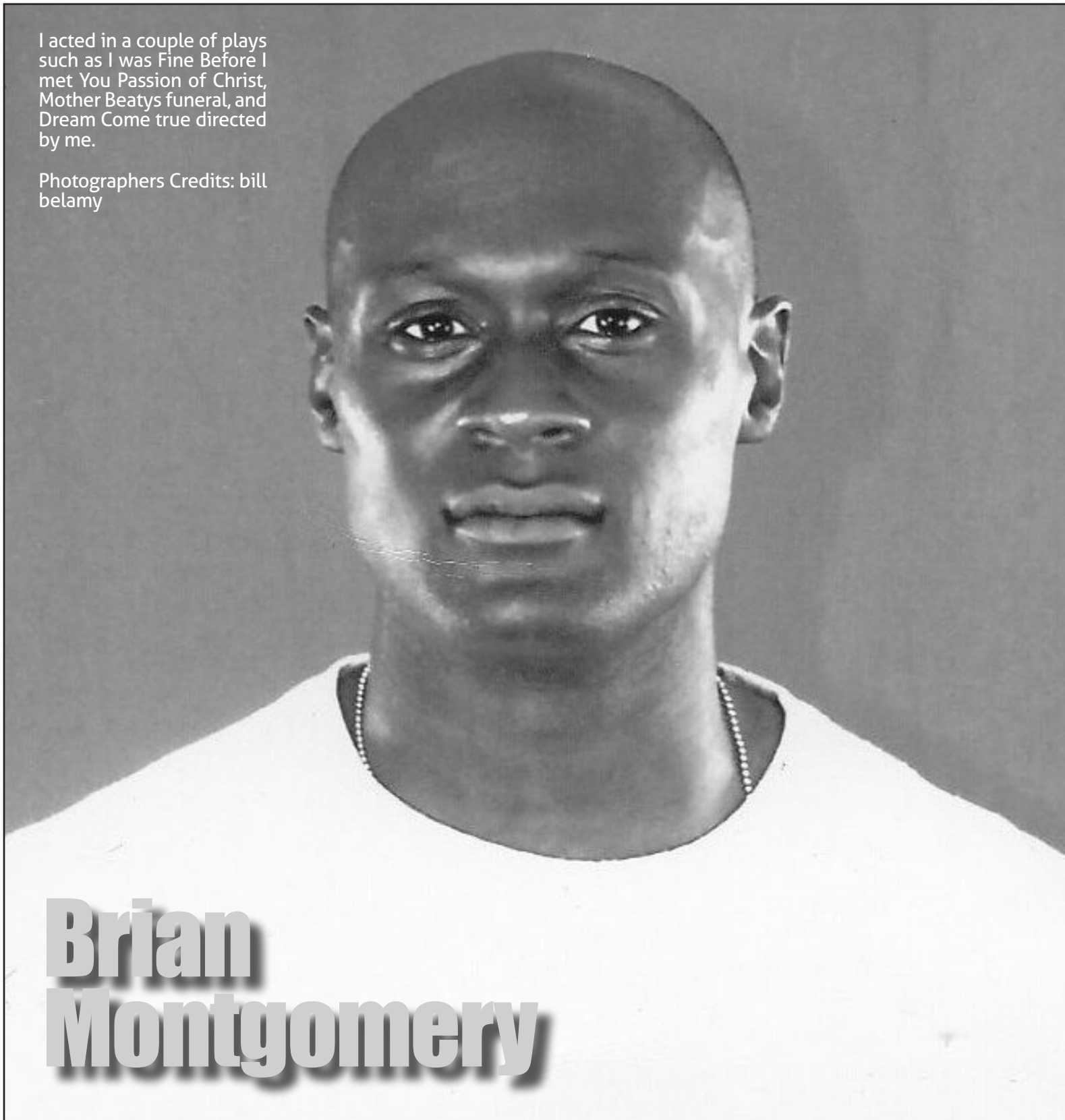


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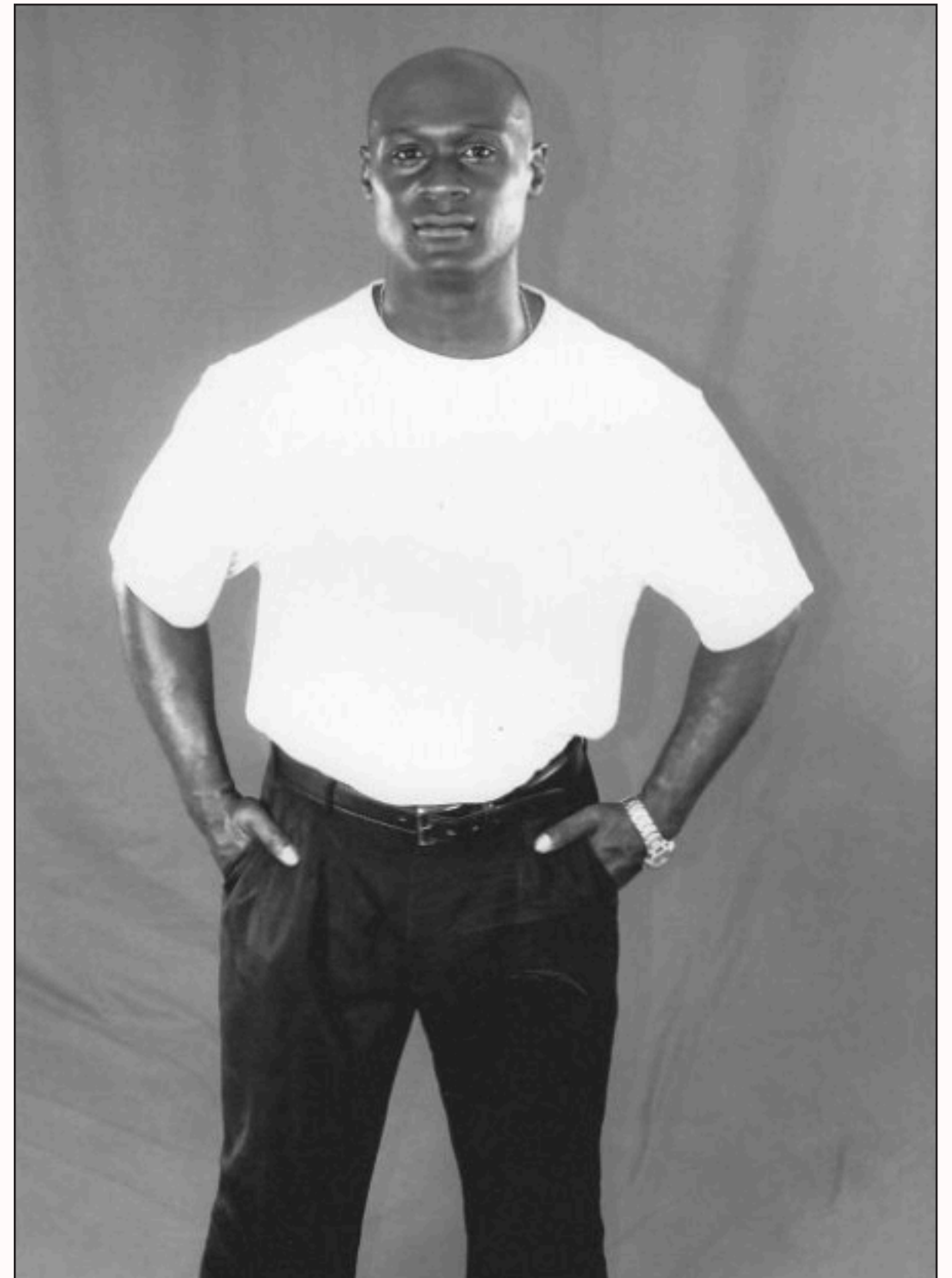


I acted in a couple of plays such as I was Fine Before I met You Passion of Christ, Mother Beatys funeral, and Dream Come true directed by me.

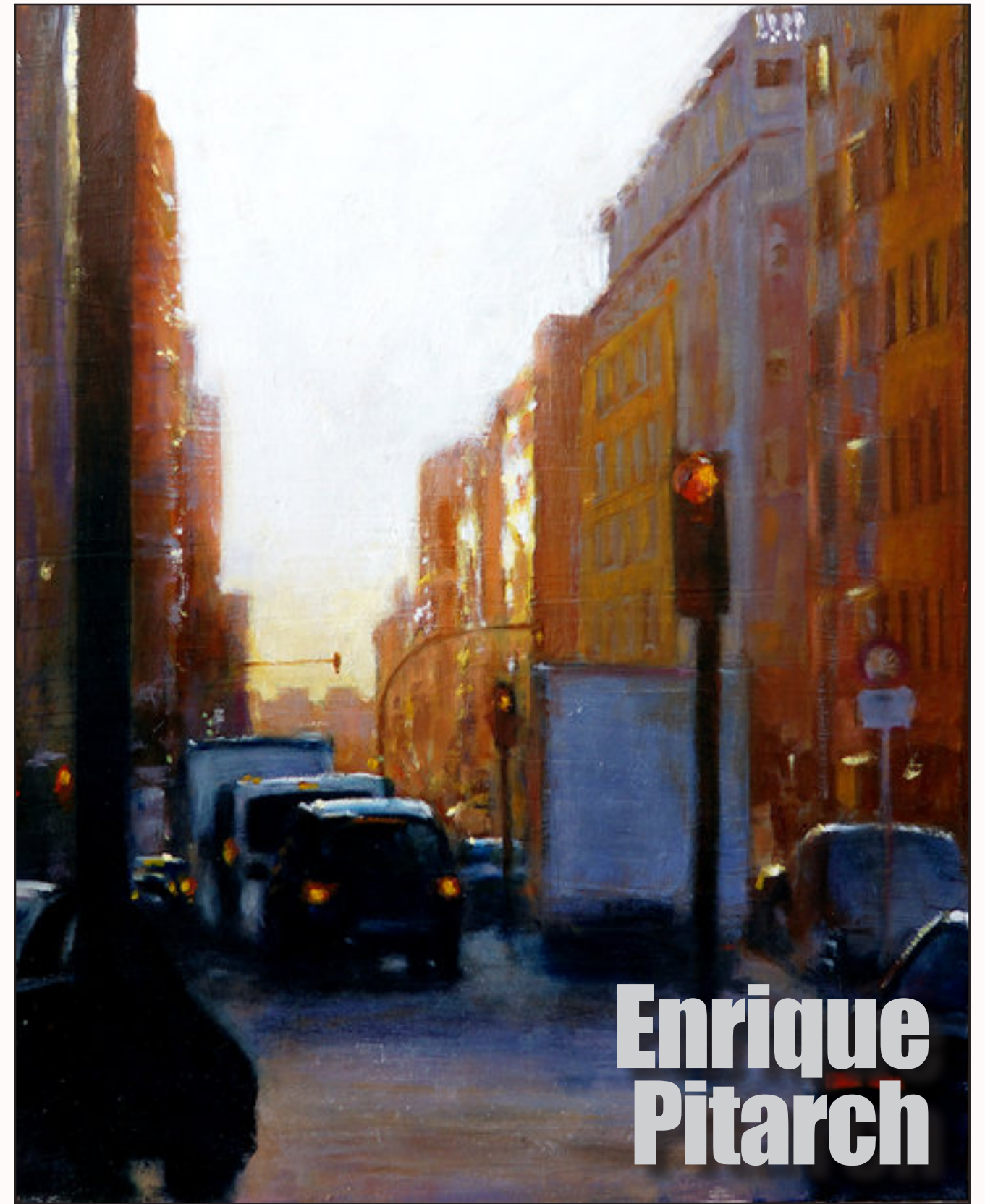


Elena Plekhova

changed its colors. On the canvases of evening cities everything began to play in rainbow tones, and the inner world and zest for life of the artist are painted in the pictures of a female body. Elena Plekhova has lived in Germany since 2019, and since then she has only devoted herself to art, combining her knowledge with a love of art and also passing it on as an art teacher. Today she mainly works with oil, but she also likes to paint acrylic paintings. Her favorite subjects range from street scenes to portraits and still lifes.

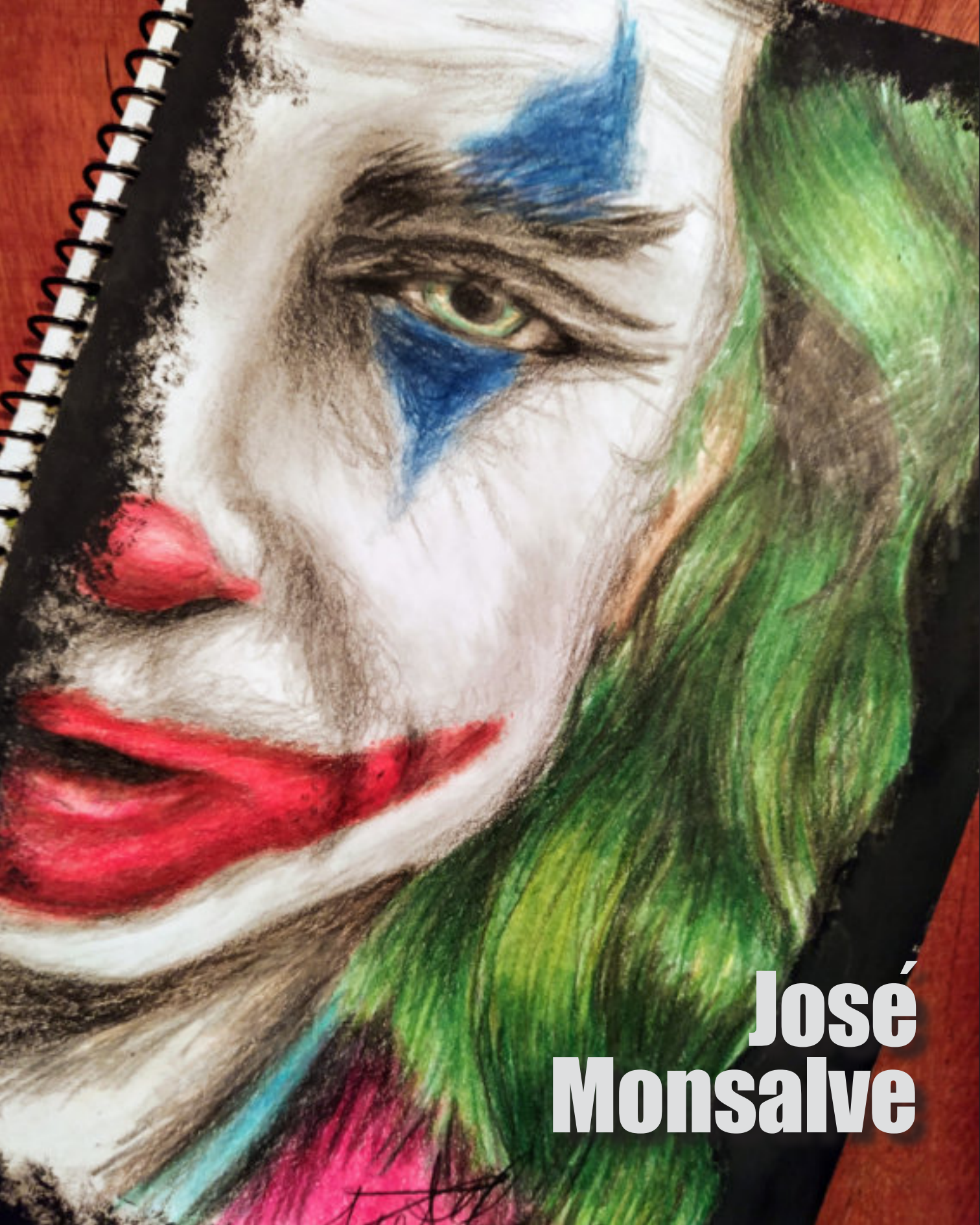

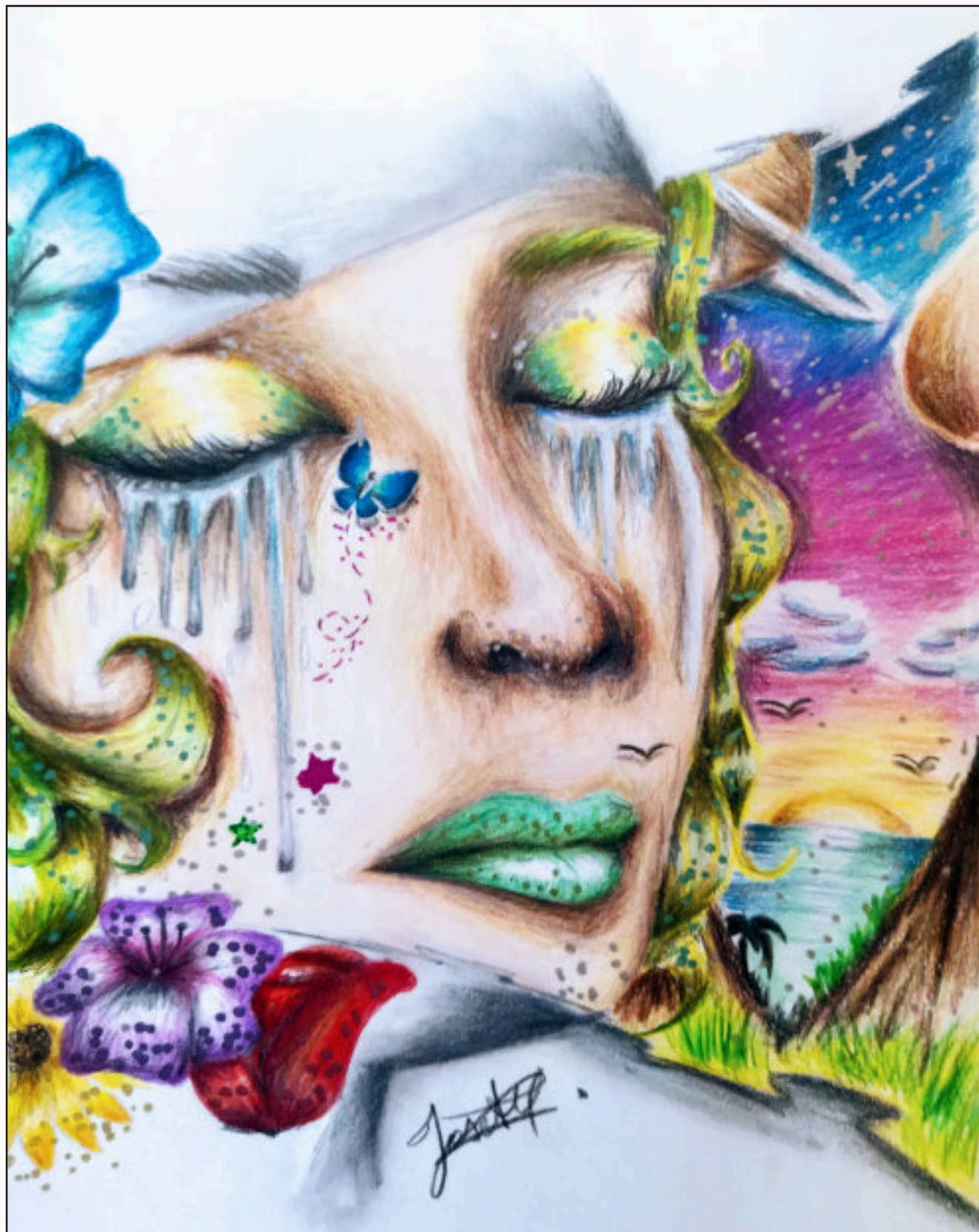

there's no absolute beauty and that nonetheless each person is uniquely beautiful.

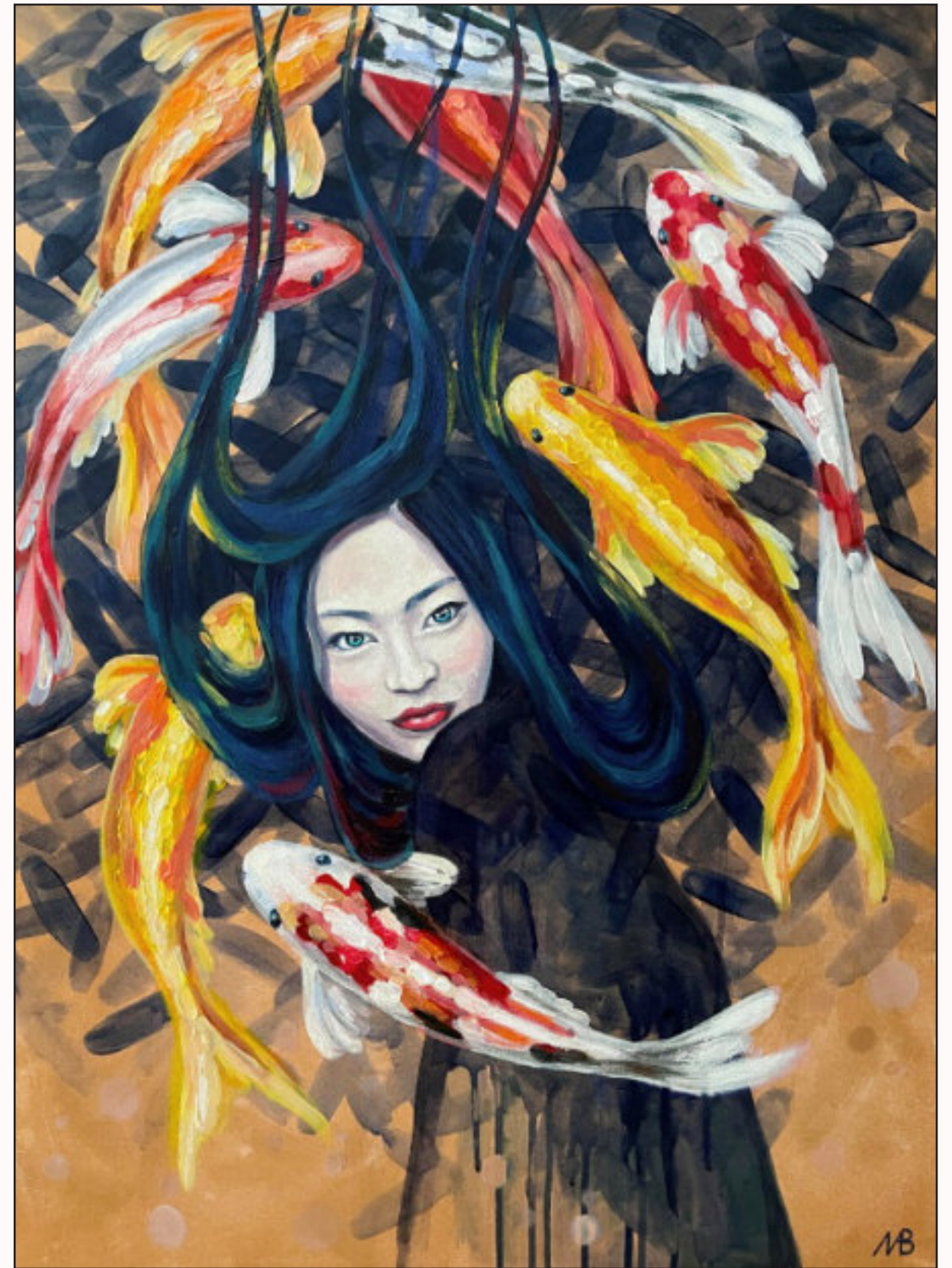
A person encompasses a world of his or her own which is so enchanting to watch from
